WHAT IS ONLINE LEARNING?


- 24x7 access
- Anywhere with Internet Connection
- Cover the same materials as those in an on-campus class.
- Scheduled on a semester basis with a beginning date and ending date.
- Within a time block (week/unit), there are reading, homework, projects, or exams. You are required to submit course work by a certain date.
- Guided by your professor, you read textbook or supplemental materials, do homework, and submit your work by a certain time.

Most Frequently Asked Questions About Online Learning

- How much time does it take?
 - You may spend more time working on your online classes due to intensive self-driven course work and technological troubleshooting.
- How often do I go online?
 - Your professor will tell you how often you are expected to log-in.
 - Plan on visiting your online class several times a week to check for new emails or new announcements and participate in new discussions.
 - You may read textbook or complete your assignments off line but submit assignments online following a deadline.
- Do I need a textbook to take an online course?
 - Yes, you are required to purchase a textbook when you take an online course. Although some online courses have videos, all online courses require you to read textbook.



 - Self-check

 - 10 -15 hours/Week 3-credit course
 - Summer -5 weeks session
 - 20-30 hours/Week- 3 credit course
 - Winter -3 weeks session
 - 6 hours/day 3 credit courses

Key to Success


- Take a self-assessment test to help you make a wise decision on the number of online courses you will be taking.
