**University Requirements for Connecticut Community College Transfers**  
 (Revised Spring, 2012)

**NOTE:** Students planning to attend SCSU in the Fall of 2013 who have accumulated 30 credits or less will follow the new LEP which is found on another handout. Students who have accumulated 30 or more credits and plan to attend SCSU in the Fall of 2013 will follow this handout.

American Political Foundations	One course from:	HIS 201, 202, POL 111 (Education majors must take HIS 201 or 202)
Communication Skills	Both courses	ENG 200 & COM 173 (MxCC students take ENG 101 before ENG 200)
Fine Arts	One course from:	ART 100,101, 102, MUS 101, MUS 104, THR 101
Foreign Language		BS degree - second semester level required (FRE, ITA or SPA 102) BA degree – fourth semester level required (FRE, ITA or SPA 202)
History of World Civilizations	One course from:	HIS 101 or 102
Literature	One course from:	ENG 221, 222, 231, 232, 251, 262
Math	One course from:	MAT 146, 168, 190, 254 ( <b>Check SCSU major before selecting course</b> )
*Natural Sciences, Group A	One course from:	BIO 105, 121, 122, 145, GLG 121, or <u>both</u> BIO 211 & 212
*Natural Science, Group B	One course from:	CHE 111, 121, PHY 110, 121
Philosophy	One course from:	PHI 101, 111, 131, 151 (Education majors take Philosophy at SCSU)
Social Sciences A	One course from:	ECN 101, 102, GEO 101, POL 102, 103, 111
Social Sciences B	One course from:	ANT 101, 105, PSY 111, SOC 101, 103, MxCC ANT 205 (Education majors take PSY 111)
