Transfer Guidelines for Middlesex Students Central Connecticut State University

Transfer Student Admissions - To be considered for transfer admissions, students must have completed 12 college level credits and received a cumulative college grade point average (GPA) of 2.00 or higher. Students with less than 12 credits must apply as high school students.

<u>Applications</u> are accepted for the fall and spring semesters. It is strongly recommended that you apply as early as possible for each semester; **before or by January 1** for the fall semester and from **June – October** for the spring semester. Students may still apply after these dates, however, your admissions decision, course selection, housing options and financial aid package may not be as favorable. Final dates for applications are June 1 for fall and December 1 for spring. However, these dates may be extended by CCSU. Always check their admissions web site for details.

Transfer Credit Evaluation- A grade of "C -" or better is required for transfer. Courses with grades of D+, D and D- are transferrable only if the student has earned an Associate's Degree from a Connecticut State Community College or Charter Oak State College. Regardless of the number of credits transferred, a student must complete a minimum of **30 credits at CCSU** in order to earn CCSU's bachelor's degree. Transfer Contacts - The Career Development & Counseling Center (CDCC) works closely with CCSU to ensure successful transfer for Middlesex students. Please use this office and/or your advisor as a resource when making career and course selection decisions.

Financial Aid - You must complete the FAFSA and other required forms by the <u>priority dates</u>. The fall semester date is **March 1**, which means you should complete the FAFSA in February. CCSU General Education Requirements

The following information serves as a *guide* to using Middlesex courses to complete the General Education requirements at CCSU. All credit bearing Middlesex courses transfer to CCSU; however, there are *specific* courses required for some majors and the list below does *not* address these requirements. Students may use the CCSU web site to obtain this information. You may also work with a counselor in the CDCC or your advisor with questions regarding appropriate transfer courses. Requirements are subject to change as course changes are made by CCSU.

STUDY AREAS

Study Area I - Arts and Humanities (9 credits) -- Courses in literature, philosophy, and fine arts are required.

Literature - Students must complete at least 3 credits in English Literature (200 level literature course) MxCC courses - ENG 210, 211, 213, 214, 218, 220, 221, 222, 231, 232, 233, 234, 262, 291, 298

<u>Arts & Humanities</u> - Students must complete 6 more credits in Arts & Humanities. The 6 credits can be courses in art, music, theatre or philosophy (except Philosophy 131, Logic) and COM 154. An additional 200 level literature can count as 3 of the 6 remaining credits; however, the other three credits must be in art, music, theatre, philosophy or COM 154 as no more than 6 credits are allowed from any one discipline.

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Study Area II -- Social Sciences (9 credits) - Courses in history, economics, geography, and political science are required.

History - Students must complete at least 3 credits in history.

<u>Social Science</u> - The additional 6 credits can be courses in geography, political science, CJS 101 and economics (except ECN 100). An additional history course can count as 3 of the 6 remaining credits; however, the other three credits must be in economics, geography or political science as no more that 6 credits are allowed from any one discipline. *Students majoring in Business, History or Education must take specific courses in this area. Consult the CCSU catalog or work with the CDCC or your advisor before choosing courses.*

<u>Study Area III</u> -- Behavioral Sciences (6 credits) - Courses in **anthropology**, **psychology**, and **sociology** are required. You may complete the six credits in one discipline. MxCC courses which can be used are: Anthropology (ANT - all courses); PSY 111, 201, 204, 298; SOC 101, 103, 120, 210, 212, 213. COM 101, CJS 213 & CJS 250 can also be used.

<u>Study Area IV</u> -- Natural Sciences (6-7 credits) - Courses in **biology, chemistry, geology and other physical sciences, environmental science** and **physics** are required. A laboratory experience is required for at least one course. Students who inadvertently complete 2 non lab science courses at MxCC may be able to complete the lab requirement at CCSU, depending on the courses completed.

SKILL AREAS

Skill Area I -- Communication Skills (6 credits) - ENG 101 is required for 3 credits.

One of the following courses may be used to fill the other 3 credits: ENG 102, ENG 110, ENG 200, ENG 202, ENG 281; COM 104, 155, 156, 173, 226, 255 or a Foreign Language course at or above the intermediate level. (SPA 211, FRE 201/202)

Skill Area II -- Mathematics Requirement (6-9 credits) - One **Mathematics** course (above MAT 137) appropriate to the student's major is required. Additional credits can be in **mathematics, statistics** or **computer science.** In addition, **PHL 131, Logic** can be used to fill this requirement. Please refer to your CCSU major before selecting courses in this area.

Skill Area III -- Foreign Language Proficiency Requirement (0-6 credits) This requirement may be met by any of the following:

- Three sequential years of one foreign language at the high school level.
- Satisfactory completion of a second-semester-level foreign language course (FRE 102, ITA 102 or SPA 112) or higher.
- Passing a standardized examination at CCSU which demonstrates knowledge of a foreign language equivalent to a second-semester course.
- Demonstration of native proficiency in a language other than English

Skill Area IV -- University Requirement (2-3 credits) - Transfer students entering CCSU with less than 15 credits must take PE 144 at CCSU. Transfer students with more than 15 credits may choose one additional course from Skill Areas I, II or III or take CSC 101, CST 120 or DGA 110.

International Requirement - Students must complete 6 credits in courses <u>designated by CCSU</u> as International. These courses do not need to be *extra* courses and may be selected when choosing courses to fulfill Study Areas, Skill Areas or Major requirements. There are many CCSU courses that meet this requirement and they are listed in their catalog. MxCC courses that may be used are as follows: ANT 205; ART 101, 102; ENG 214; ENG 262, FRE 201, 202; HIS 101, 102, 107, 121, 122; MUS 101, 104; PHL 151; POL 102, POL 103; SPA 211, 212

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
