



Transfer Guidelines for Middlesex Students: University Requirements

The information below can be used to select Middlesex courses that will transfer to meet the *University Requirements* for specific majors at UConn including Agriculture, Health and Natural Resources, Engineering, Fine Arts, Nursing and Education. This guide is intended for use in coordination with the UConn catalog, your advisor or a counselor in the Career Development & Counseling Center (CDCC) *as some degrees require specific courses in various areas*.
