

Transfer Guidelines for Middlesex Students: College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (CLAS)

The information below can be used to select Middlesex courses that will transfer to meet the *University Requirements* of the College of Liberal Arts & Sciences (CLAS) at UConn. This guide is intended for use in coordination with the UConn catalog, your advisor or a counselor in the Career Development & Counseling Center (CDCC) as some degrees require specific courses in various areas.
