
Most positions will request that you contact the employer to schedule a time to meet or stop by to fill out an application. However, some jobs will request that you send a resume & cover letter.

Transfer Planning

Planning to Transfer This Spring?

If so, it's time to start applying. Many colleges and universities have early deadlines; some are as early as October 1st. So, what do you need to do? Here is a quick guide.

- Identify your transfer institutions and obtain an application online. We recommend that you visit the colleges and universities you identify to get a better gauge of how well the college meets your educational as well as social needs.
- 2) Find out if you qualify as a transfer student. Many colleges and universities require a minimum number of college credit hours to be considered a transfer student. In addition, as part of your application you may have to forward high school and/or SAT information.
- The application may require an essay and/ or recommendation letters. Utilize application guides to write your essay and review it with an English instructor or our office staff.

- Remember to contact individuals for a recommendation early enough to provide them sufficient time to write a letter. If the application only asks for names of individuals providing recommendations, you still need to obtain permission from these people prior to using their names.
- 5) Send official transcripts from Middlesex and any other college or university you may have attended directly to each transfer institution. Find out if the college or university wants mid semester grades for your current classes. You will need to forward transcripts at the time of application and at the end of the semester after you obtain all Fall semester grades.
- 6) If you are planning to apply for financial aid, you must list all colleges on your **FAFSA** application. They will determine if you qualify under their quidelines. In addition, the Financial Aid deadline may be before the application deadline. Many are between October 15 and November 1. It is best to apply to the college and complete Financial Aid requirements by October 15 for the

- Most students transfer from two to four-year institutions without first receiving a credential from the two-year institution, which is consistent with findings from previous Signature Reports.



Dear Students,

Fall at Middlesex Community College is always an exciting time! New faculty, new friends, and new challenges. As you begin to settle in to the semester, new questions may also arise. If some of these relate to determining a career or a major, we would like to remind you of the services our office provides.

Whether this is your first or fifth semester taking classes at the college, some students may not have determined what field of study they want to pursue. In our office, there are counselors available to assist you in making, at least, some tentative decisions. There are several ways in which the staff may work with you in clarifying your educational and/or career direction. Through first speaking with a counselor in an individual appointment, you might begin to shed light on your strengths, interests, and goals and how they may relate to your selection of major/career. Within the process, it might be recommended to you to utilize the office's computerized guidance system, Focus. Within this program are interactive exercises to aid you in identifying your skills, self-assessed abilities and values as they pertain to various occupations. In addition to this, the Career Development and Counseling Center has library resources on various careers. The counselors may also assist you in developing an individual plan by which to gather information on jobs and careers in other ways. Quite often it is easier to select a program of study once you have determined the potential career goal of your education.

After attending Middlesex, some students plan to transfer to a bachelor level degree granting college or university. After determining which colleges you may want to transfer to, the counseling center staff may assist you in selecting courses that may meet the requirements of those institutions. In addition, the college has articulation agreements with the public and some private colleges and universities in the state. The counselors can also assist you in connecting with representatives from out of state schools to ensure that you make sound selections of courses.

Many students need to work while attending college. The Career Development and Counseling Center also helps in this area. We maintain listings for seasonal, full and part-time employment. Throughout the course of the year recruiters from corporate and social service fields come to campus to actively pursue meeting with and hiring Middlesex students. In addition, students may get support in resume and employment writing, interview preparation, and job search strategies from the counseling staff.

As you begin to face some of these challenges, remember, the Career Development and Counseling Center is here to aid you in answering questions of career selection, transfer/academic advising, job search and adjustment to college issues. Please call (860)343-5826 to schedule an appointment.
