

Ways to Transfer to the Connecticut State Colleges & Universities (CSCU)

Central, Eastern, Southern and Western State Universities & Charter Oak State College

The Connecticut State Colleges and Universities system (CSCU) has established various agreements to assist students with successful transfer between institutions. Specific information regarding the transfer of courses and programs is available on the Career Development & Counseling Center (CDCC) web site <http://mxcc.edu/cdcc/transfer-planning/>. Students who plan to transfer are encouraged to consult with a counselor in the CDCC or their academic advisor early in their academic career to make the best possible transition to their selected four-year college or university. ***

Transfer Navigator – Transfer Tickets

Transfer Tickets is a program where Connecticut Community College (CCC) students can complete associate degree programs and transfer to the Connecticut State Universities and Charter Oak State College offering their major without losing academic credit. Upon transfer, students are guaranteed full junior status and can complete a bachelor's degree in their major without losing credits or being required to take extra courses. Dual Admission/Transfer Compact Agreement

The Transfer Compact is an agreement between the 12 Connecticut Community Colleges and the four Connecticut State Universities. It is available to CCC students who have earned (received grades from) **15 or fewer college credits** and who plan to transfer to a Connecticut State University after they have completed an Associate Degree. Students are guaranteed admission to their designated institution upon completion of the Associate Degree with a 2.0 grade point average. In addition, students are advised by both schools throughout their associate-degree program. Students interested in enrolling in the Transfer Compact must meet with a counselor in the CDCC. Degree Completion and Guaranteed Admission

CCC students who receive an Associate Degree with a grade point average of 2.0 or higher are guaranteed admission to one of the four Connecticut State Universities. Students will be admitted as juniors, but must still satisfy the University's General Education requirements. To ensure the successful transfer of all your CCC credits, students who utilize this program should meet with a counselor in the CDCC. ***

Transfer Before Degree Completion

For some students, completing an Associate Degree before transferring is not desired or possible because of the student's chosen major and/or life goals. Students with a 2.0 or higher grade point average who do not intend to earn a degree from Middlesex may still transfer to a CSCU institution as long as they meet specific transfer requirements. To ensure the successful transfer of all your CCC credits, students who utilize this option should meet with a counselor in the CDCC. ***

*** Please Note:

- 1) **Some CSCU majors have specific course and/or grade point average entrance requirements that must be met in order to apply to the program.**
- 2) **Some CSCU programs are competitive admission majors. This means that programs have their own admission requirements and a selective screening process. They often have their own application deadline and may require test scores, portfolios, auditions, letters of recommendation, or interviews. Completion of the minimum admission requirements does NOT guarantee admission to competitive majors. If you are admitted to a CSCU through one of the methods above, this is not a guarantee that you will eventually be admitted to the competitive major of your choice.**
