



Blackboard

Blackboard Ally was implemented in February of 2019. In the Blackboard Ally environment, students are able to open a file with a choice of formats that works well on their computer (Microsoft or PDF). For a file that is not ADA-compliant, faculty will see a “red” mark underneath the file title. By clicking on the red mark, faculty will see the steps needed to convert the file to an ADA-compliant format.

In Fall 2018, a Learning Management System/Educational Technology Survey was conducted system-wide. The survey results and the summary report have been shared with the MxCC faculty. At the March 19th Academic Assembly, Professor Rebecca Rist-Brown presented the survey results and sought feedback from faculty. The major recommendation of the committee is that a RFP (Request for Proposal) be established to seek a learning management system that will meet academic needs. At the meeting, faculty and staff unanimously approved the four LMS Ed Tech Survey Committee’s recommendations without reservation.

Distance Learning

Winter 2018

A total of 267 students registered to 17 online courses, reflecting an 8% increase in seats and a 6% increase in course offering over Winter 2017. One session of orientation was provided to first-time online students.

Spring 2019

By March 7th, there are 1695 registered seats to online courses, reflecting a 6% increase over Spring 2018. Eighty two online courses are offered, reflecting a 17% increase over Spring 2018. Four sessions of orientations were provided to first time online students.

Ed2Go Online Learning

From January to March of 2019, 52 students registered Ed2Go 6-week online courses or career training programs, reflecting a 30% increase over the same time period of 2018.

Summer 2019

Four sessions of summer courses are on the schedule, including a total of 76 online courses. To help first-time online students get started, five sessions of orientation are scheduled during the first week of each term.

Fall 2019

Eighty-six online courses are on schedule, and four sessions of orientation are scheduled to help first time online students get started with online learning.

We provided an annual enrollment report for NECHE accreditation. MxCC is currently offering 25 programs that are at least 50% of courses online. Eleven out of 25 programs are fully online. These programs are General Studies, Business Studies, Communication Studies, Criminal Justice, Criminology Studies, English Studies, History Studies, Liberal Arts and Science, Political Science Studies, Sociology Studies, and Spanish Studies.
