KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Dr. Katie Lynch received her B.A. in English and History from Dartmouth College and her M.A. and Ph.D. in Literary Studies from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. She is currently an Associate Professor of English at Rockland Community College (SUNY), where she also chairs the nationally recognized Sam Draper Honors Program. She has been working with open educational resources (OERs) since 2016.

Lyndsay Bratton is the Assistant Director for Digital Scholarship and the art librarian at Connecticut College. She leads the Digital Scholarship Fellows Program, which supports faculty developing digital research projects and scholarly websites.

Dr. Patrick Bryan is an associate professor of Biology and is currently in his twentieth year of teaching. Dr. Bryan has developed and utilized innovative technology to aid student learning since he first began teaching. His methodology has evolved from interactive web sites for teaching animal biology, to Camtasia lectures with animation, to Khan Academy style drawing videos, to his most recent work with Learning Glass lectures. Dr. Bryan has also conducted research on marine invertebrates' larval development in labs as far ranging as McMurdo Station, Antarctica, to Daya Bay, China, to Hopkins Marine Station, CA.

Professor Emeritus Elizabeth (Betsey) Doane of Housatonic Community College is now in her 50th year of teaching. Betsey has taught mathematics and computer science and now teaches mathematics online with total vision loss. She has an M.A. in mathematics from The University of Massachusetts and an M.S. in computer and information sciences from The University of New Haven.

Samuel Kapros is a Career Development Specialist, Adjunct Faculty, and self-proclaimed geek at Tunxis Community College. While completing his doctoral dissertation, Sam has developed Open Education Resources and dedicated his time to research new and low-cost technological advances in education.

She leads the open education initiative on campus including the OER grant program which currently supports ten faculty in the creation and adoption of OER for their courses.
