

Commencement Address

State Representative Quentin "Q" Phipps is honored to serve the residents of Middletown in the 100th District, which includes the Downtown, Northend, South Fire District, Wesleyan Hills and Wesleyan University areas.

Quentin, a lifelong resident of Middletown who resides on Bretton Road, takes great pride in championing equitable solutions for all and is the first African American to represent the City of Middletown in the Connecticut General Assembly.

He is a graduate of Middletown Public Schools, earned a Bachelor's in Business Administration from Bryant University, and a Master's of Public Administration from Villanova University.

Shortly after his graduation from Bryant, Quentin continued working in community banking in Hartford's Northend. In 2012, "Q" embarked on a new professional career path in not-for-profit management and was named Executive Director of the Middletown Downtown Business District. As director for the DBD, he launched Middletown's first Middletown Restaurant Week.

Quentin now serves Excellence Community Schools as their Director of Advocacy and Policy. In this role, he builds capacity and supports Excellence Community School families through advocacy, community organizing, and strategic partnering. "Q" is also the co-founder and co-director of EquityCT, a nonprofit dedicated to creating learning opportunities, building actionable understanding of equity, and consciously dismantling systemic inequity through action and civic engagement.

Phipps was named "40 Under 40" in Fairfield County Business Journal (2017) Hartford Business Journal (2015) and Connecticut Magazine (2013) for his professional and volunteerism achievements. "Q" was an American Council for Young Political Leaders Russia Delegate (2016), Community Foundation of Middlesex County Next Generation Leader (2018), Jewish Federation of North America Municipal Leader Israel Exchange (2019), and a State Legislative Leader Foundation Emerging Leader (2020).

Quentin takes great pride in his involvement with numerous charitable and service organizations. He served on the Oddfellows Playhouse Youth Theater Board of Directors, Middlesex United Way Board of Directors, Middletown Racial Justice Coalition (steering committee), Middlesex Substance Abuse Action Council Board of Directors and as an active member in Cross Street Zion A.M.E. Church, Middletown Young Democrats, The Community Foundation of Middlesex County Live Local Give Local 365 Fund, and the Middlesex Chamber of Commerce Young Professionals Alliance (steering committee). He is a former Columbus House (formerly Red Cross) Chocolate to the Rescue event Chair and has also served on the board of directors for Middlesex Historical Society and Mount Saint John Academy and was president of Connecticut Young Democrats.

"Q" Phipps was elected City Treasurer in 2011 and re-elected in 2015. In 2007, Quentin was elected to the Planning & Zoning commission and in 2009 he was unanimously elected Chair of the Commission.

Awards

Class of 2021 Valedictorian - The class valedictorian is the student with the highest cumulative quality point average. The 2021 Class Valedictorian is Louis Beauchamp.

Awards for Academic Excellence - The Awards for Academic Excellence are presented to graduating students who have achieved a cumulative quality point average of 4.00, and who have completed fifty percent of their requirements at MxCC. Recipients are Louis Beauchamp, Thomas Laskowski, Kendyl Ortiz, Matthew Ryan, and Brian Schramm.



The Pritchett-Taylor Scholarships - The Pritchett-Taylor Scholarships, established by Mary L. Pritchett and Edith Taylor, are awarded to the seniors with the highest cumulative quality point average who have earned at least thirty credits at MxCC, and who have attended full-time for at least two semesters. Recipients are Louis Beauchamp and Thomas Laskowksi.

Phi Theta Kappa academic honor society graduates are identified by their gold stoles, cords, and tassels.

Academic Regalia

The academic dress worn today originated in the universities of the Middle Ages when classrooms were unheated and the academic gown and hood kept scholars warm. It became a distinctive symbol of academic pursuit, setting the academic apart from the non-academic, hence the "gown versus the town" phrase that continues even today.

Prior to the American Civil War, most American college and university students wore the gown daily during the entire term of study. The gown became standardized in 1894 when the American Intercollegiate Commission determined that all robes would be black. The master's robe is distinguishable by long, closed sleeves; the doctor's gown by a facing of black velvet from the hem to the neck and back, with three velvet bands around each sleeve above the elbow.

The traditional hood displays significant colors. The lining represents the colors of the university granting the wearer's highest degree. The color of the facing of the hood signifies the individual's academic discipline or school of study. Although there has been much innovation in gown and cap design in recent years, the standard colors representing the various academic disciplines have remained the same.

The Mace

The College Mace is carried at Commencement exercises. The first dated record of the use of the academic mace goes back to Vienna University in the year of 1385. The academic mace served as a sign of strength and authority and was carried by a designated member of the faculty during solemn processions. The Mace is adorned with configurations as well as inscriptions which eulogized and commemorated the institution.
