CLIN = Clinical
COOP = Cooperative Learning

HYBR = Online and Classroom
INDE = Independent Study
INTN = Internship
LRON = Live/Remote & Online Component
OLCR = Online with Campus Requirement
ONLN = Fully Online
TRAD = Classroom



What is an LRON class?

Students registered for Live/Remote Online Teaching (LRON) courses will learn material online LIVE with an instructor during the scheduled days/times. Students are expected to attend class remotely via video conference. For more information on LRON courses: <https://mxcc.edu/distance/iron/>

What is a Hybrid class?

A hybrid class combines traditional face-to-face learning in the classroom with online learning that students complete outside of the classroom.

What is an OLCR class?

Coursework is delivered asynchronously through Blackboard. Students must meet all due dates and deadlines set by the course syllabus. Students may be required to attend an on-ground or virtual orientation and proctored exams.



What is MyCTState?

MyCTState is a "one stop shop" portal web site where students may log in to access Student Self-Service, Blackboard, Office 365, Library databases, Microsoft Office, and their student college email.

To access:

1. Go to my.ctstate.edu
2. Log in with your NetID and NetID password.

What is Blackboard?

Our online learning management system where instructors may provide students with online access to course syllabi, lectures, homework, etc. To access, see MyCTState.

What is Student Self-Service?

Student Self-Service, a.k.a. "Banner", is where students may access registration services, academic records, financial aid information, and much more. To access, see above under MyCTState.

Find Course and Textbook Information

1. Go to <https://my.ctstate.edu>
2. Go to Other Resources on right-hand side.
3. Click on Browse Classes.
4. Click on Select a Term (Fall 2023, etc.)
5. Select campus (Middlesex).
6. Click on Title of Course.
7. Click on Bookstore link on left.
8. Click on Middlesex. You will be taken to MxCC Bookstore textbook information.

What is my NetID?

If you are a student, your NetID is composed of the following two items:

1. Username: Banner ID (without the "@")
2. Domain: @STUDENT.COMMNET.EDU

Example:

87654321@student.comnet.edu

NOTE: **Your NetID is NOT the same thing as your email address.** Do not use this as an email address. Student email addresses end in @mail.ct.edu.

3. Click on "Need help signing in for the first time?" link for initial NetID and password.
